Headquarters: Vigo (Spain), relocated in 1 July 2008

Operational from 1 January 2007



General objectives

EU Fisheries control: who does what?

- Member States are responsible for control of:
 - ✓ Activities in their waters/territory
 - √ Vessels flying their flag
 - √ Their nationals
- European Commission: Formulates policy (CFP) to be adopted by the legislator and verifies its implementation by Member States
- EFCA: Coordinates and assists Member States and the European Commission














EFCA Offshore fisheries patrol vessels

Ocean Protector and Ocean Guardian are deployed in the Atlantic Ocean, while Ocean Sentinel is deployed the Mediterranean Sea. They are equipped with RPAS

They serve as a platform for inspections for EU Inspectors and Third Countries inspectors

EFCA also charters an airplane to support JDP operations





International Dimension



Support the EU in the implementation of the external dimension of the CFP

Areas of intervention:

- Implement JDPs to ensure the EU contribution to the fisheries control in the RFMOs
- Support to RFMOs and control WG and fora with Third Countries
- Capacity building in the framework of SFPAs
- Fight IUU at international level
- Other actions: Projects: PESCAO, Algeria, efishMed, ECOFISH







PESCAO Project Overview




The PESCAO project, funded by the UE, aims to enhance the contribution of fisheries resources to sustainable development, food security and poverty alleviation in West Africa




Axis for the intervention of EFCA-PESCAO (2018-2023): Activities/scope



EFCA supports to FCWC and SRFC and their 13 Member States









Harmonisation and updating of national legal frameworks





Document yearly updated on the basis of information received from countries (through FCWC and SRFC) +
DG Mare









Facilitate the cooperation between the actors



- In the framework of the legal study: updating information on the MCS administrative organisation in each FCWC/SRFC Member State.
- Support to reinforcement of the interservices coordination in the framework of the legal support.
- Support to the organisation of inter-agency workshops









Support to regional MCS structures



- Assistance for the setting-up of the FCWC Regional Maritime Surveillance and Control Centre (RMCSC)
- Support to drafting of SOPs for the RMCSC









Support to joint control campaigns



- Support to 12 SRFC joint operations + 1 African Nemo joint Patrol in 2023
- Support to 1 FCWC pilot joint patrol at sea with Benin and Togo + 2 African Nemo joint Patrols
- Chartering of aerial asset for supporting operations
